Muscogee (Creek) Nation Brief History

The North American settlement for the Muscogee people was in the southeastern United States in present-day Alabama, Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, and Tennessee.

In 1540, Muscogee territory was invaded by Spanish forces led by Hernando de Soto. At that time, there were six to seven Muscogee-related regional governments.



In 1690, when relations with English colonies began, these regional governments united as the Creek Confederacy. The Confederacy was a union of some 200 separate tribes, known as tribal towns. This confederacy of tribal towns was unified by trade, religion, and five or six common languages within the Muscogean language group.

The Confederacy signed its first treaty with Great Britain in 1707. Other treaties would follow. After the American Revolution, the Muscogee Confederacy entered into 20 separate treaties and four additional agreements with the fledgling federal government.


In 1814 however, President Andrew Jackson split the Confederacy into the Muscogee and Seminole

Nations. Ultimately, Jackson would initiate the Muscogee removal between 1824 and 1838, known by many non-Indians as the Trail of Tears.

Despite the forced relocation, the Muscogee people began reorganizing their government in Indian Territory, present-day Oklahoma. A written constitution was adopted in 1867.

Though promised sovereignty in the Nation's new home, the Allotment Act of 1897 divided tribal lands into 160-acre allotments for individual ownership. After Oklahoma statehood in 1907, federal policy suppressed tribal governments. Policy prevented the tribe from electing its own officials and tribal officers were appointed by the U.S. Department of Interior. The Five Tribes Act of 1970 reversed policy and allowed the tribes to elect their own officials. In 1979, the Muscogee Nation ratified a written constitution. The Constitution provides for a tripartite government composed of executive, legislative, and judicial branches.







The executive branch is led by the principal chief and the second chief is also a member of this branch. The legislative branch consists of an elected National Council.

The judicial branch consists of a District Court and a Supreme Court whose members are nominated by the principal chief and confirmed by the National Council. Today, the Muscogee Nation continues to make progress. The tribe is committed to improving the quality of life for its people through a commitment to quality in all facets of tribal life. Ever mindful of its rich heritage, the Muscogee Nation is poised for the future.



Legislative Branch



National Council

The Legislative Branch is comprised of the National Council of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and oversees proposed legislation.

Under the guidance of the Almighty God, our Creator, We the People of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, do promote Unity, to establish Justice, and secure to ourselves and our children the blessings of Freedom, to preserve our basic Rights and Heritage, to strengthen and preserve self and local Government, in continued relations with the United States of America, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.

Judicial Branch



Supreme Court

In recognition of the inherent sovereign authority of the Mvskoke Nation, our Nation's citizens ratified the modern Mvskoke Nation Constitution on August 17, 1979. The modern Mvskoke Constitution established a tripartite system of government with three independent, co-equal branches: executive, legislative and judicial. The Mvskoke Nation Supreme Court was re-established by Article VII of the modern Mvskoke Constitution. The Mvskoke Supreme Court is vested with the judicial power and exclusive appellate jurisdiction over all civil and criminal matters that fall under the jurisdiction of the Mvskoke Nation. The Supreme Court serves as the final interpretive authority on the modern Mvskoke Constitution and laws.

The Mvskoke Nation Supreme Court consist of seven justices. Each justice serves a six-year term after nomination by the principal chief and confirmation by a majority vote of the National Council. Annually, the Supreme Court selects from its members a chief justice and vice -chief justice to lead the court.





Notice will be sent to each applicant once application for admission is approved. 


The District Court of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation is the court that initially hears most cases arising within the tribal jurisdiction. Included in these cases are family, juvenile, criminal, protective orders and general civil cases. These cases may be brought by or against tribal citizens or by the Muscogee Nation. The court decides cases based upon the laws of the Nation and has to interpret those laws. Cases are heard by the two district court judges. If an appeal is taken from a decision of the District Court, the MCN Supreme Court hears the case. District Court

The Judicial Branch is comprised of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation District Court and the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court is the Nation's highest court with appellate jurisdiction over cases appealed from the District Court. The Supreme Court is the final authority on the Constitution and Laws of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.




District Court Clerk's Office

Executive Office of the Principal Chief

The Constitution of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation in Article V Section 1. States that "...the executive power shall be vested in and shall be known as The Office of the Principal Chief of the Muscogee Nation and Section 2. States that "...The Principal Chief shall create and organize the Executive Office of the Principal Chief."

Emergency Assistance

This program allows for assistance to be provided to citizens in the event of a break in income or life altering event. However, in order to be eligible for this assistance applicants must first seek help from all other resources.

Requirements:

- Extenuating circumstance
- Letter of denial from other resources
- MCN Tribal membership cards for all enrolled household members
- Notice from landlord or original utility bill in applicant's name (must be cut-off notice)
- Proof of income or proof of unemployment for all adults in the home
- Any doctor statements that verify your need

Fuel Assistance

Fuel assistance is provided to the citizens seeking employment or medical treatment. This assistance allows for citizens to receive a limited amount of regular unleaded fuel once a year for doctor appointments or job interviews

Requirements:

- MCN tribal membership card
- An appointment slip from the doctor or interview/start date from the employer
- Receipts must be returned to this office to remain eligible for any future assistance



Grocery assistance

Grocery assistance is provided to our citizens in need who are experiencing extenuating circumstances. This program allows for assistance to be provided to the citizens in the event of the break in income or life altering event. However, in order to be eligible for this assistance applicants must first seek help from all other resources.

Requirements:

- Extenuating circumstance
- Letter of denial from other resources
- MCN Tribal membership cards for all enrolled household members
- Proof of income or proof of unemployment for all adults in the home




The assistance provided by the Office of Second Chief is available once annually starting from the date you were last assisted provided you have complied with any necessary requests.



Office of Chief of Staff

The primary purpose of the Chief of Staff office is to assist the Principal Chief in the day-to-day operation of the tribal government. The office consists of the Chief of Staff, Dr. Bo Colbert, the Executive Secretary, Tania Bear, and the Policy Analyst, Brenda Golden. Duties of this office range from activity on personnel situations, signature authority in absence of the Principal Chief, collaboration with lobbyist groups at the federal and state levels, and assistance with each of the Cabinet members in matters of concern that range from policy, assessment, and operation. Tribal sovereignty is the guiding principle that all decision-making revolves around. Tribal sovereignty has a political aspect, a policy aspect, and a practice or operational aspect. It is vital that this office be familiar with and understand this concept at a level equivalent to its overall interpretation and meaning.

Tourism and Recreation

This mission of Tourism and Recreation is to create and implement promotional efforts to increase awareness of Muscogee culture, history and governmental economic impact while delivering daily customer service and daily departmental operations.

The MCNTR is responsible for producing ongoing public relations efforts to increase public awareness of the benefits of the Muscogee (Creek) Nations tourism product. MCNTR encourages travel within the state and promotes regional attractions by positioning the Muscogee (Creek) Nation as a destination with a variety of leisure attractions and activities.



MCNTR generates inquiries through regional advertisements in magazines, newspapers, digital campaigns, and television. The Mvskoke Hall of Fame was created to acknowledge and honor the accomplishments of Muscogee (Creek) citizens who have brought recognition to and/or have made outstanding contributions to the quality of life and development of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation on a local, national, or international level. Each October, Hall of Fame inductees are honored in a ceremony that includes a silent auction and dinner. All funds raised by the gala are used to fund scholarships provided by the Creek Nation Scholarship Foundation and for the operation of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Festival.



MUSCOGEE (CREEK) NATION COUNCIL OAK CEREMONY

Each year, the leaders of Muscogee (Creek) ceremonial grounds gather at the intersection of 18th Street and Cheyenne Avenue in Tulsa at the Muscogee (Creek) Council Oak Park to commemorate the arrival of the Locv Pokv people to Indian Territory in 1836. Ceremonial leaders are joined by tribal and city of Tulsa officials and many observers to hear the history of the Muscogee (Creek) Council Oak, the Locv Pokv tribal town, Muscogee cultural traditions, and rekindle a ceremonial fire. Social stickball, dinner, and stomp dance are held at the Tulsa Creek Indian Community following the commemorative ceremony.






The Office of Public Gaming acts to promote and ensure integrity, accountability, security, honesty and fairness of the operation and administration of all gaming activities.

The Office of Public Gaming (OPG), through the commissioner and his staff, has the responsibility to administer and enforce Title 21, the Muscogee Nation Public Gaming Code, OPG Regulations and the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act. The Muscogee (Creek) Nation has eleven (11) tribally licensed gaming facilities. Any person conducting public gaming operations within the exterior boundaries of the Nation, which is subject of the jurisdiction of the Nation, is required to adhere to provisions of Title 21. The OPG was established to provide for the orderly development, administration to regulation of public gaming as well as other authorized enterprises within the exterior boundaries of the Nation.

Tax Commission/Motor Vehicle Registration



The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Tax Commission has three primary functions: Tobacco Tax, Sales Tax and Motor Vehicle. Tobacco Tax: the purpose and intent of this is to regulate the sale and of cigarettes and other tobacco products within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation jurisdiction and to raise revenues. Sales Tax: the sales tax increases the revenues of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, complement its regulatory jurisdiction and otherwise benefit the Nation's citizens. Motor Vehicle: titling and registration of personal vehicles. Each citizen is eligible for up to two discounted vehicles; this includes veteran, handicap, and elderly. At the moment, we do not tag boats or manufactured homes.

Eligibility:

In order to be eligible for a Muscogee Nation tag, you must: be an enrolled citizen, reside within the Nation's jurisdictional boundaries, have the original title, a valid Oklahoma driver's license or I.D. and provide current insurance verification. Citizenship Board

The Citizenship Board office is governed by a board consisting of five members. This office provides services to citizens of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation or to potential citizens in giving direction or assisting in the lineage verification process of the Muscogee (Creek) people. The mission of this office is to verify the lineage of descendants of persons listed on the 1906 Dawes Roll. In doing so, research is involved in the whole aspect of obtaining citizenship.

Presently, our Nation has 77,154 enrolled citizens as of November, 2013.

The criteria for citizenship is that you must be Creek by blood and trace back to a direct ancestor listed on the 1906 Dawes Roll by issuance of birth and/or death certificates. Example: If your mother or father is enrolled as of 1981, all that would be required of you as an applicant is your original state certified birth certificate listing your Creek parent(s). However, if you are tracing back to a direct ancestor listed on the 1906 Dawes Roll, we require the death certificate of the original enrollee and birth certificates of each person thereafter leading up to the applicant. Citizenship applications must be picked up or mailed to you.



Election Board

It is the purpose of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Election Board to maintain the highest level of integrity in conducting the Muscogee (Creek) Nation elections according to the election codes, Title 19 of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Code and enforce the election codes in a responsible, impartial and unbiased manner. And to inform all enrolled registered voters of elections and promote voter registration throughout the Muscogee (Creek) Nation eight districts, as well as to the absentee voters outside the Muscogee (Creek) Nation boundaries.

Contract Health Services

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Contract Health Services (CHS) Program was established as a result of tribal nations ability to receive funds from the Department of Health and Human Services administered by Indian Health Service (IHS) to provide outsourced specialized health care for outpatient and inpatient services for their Contract Health Service delivery area.


CHS is a federally funded program and not an insurance company or an entitlement program. Funds are used to supplement and compliment other health care resources available to eligible Indian people. Since IHS programs are not fully funded, the CHS program must rely on specific regulations for eligibility, notification, residency and a medical priority rating system.

- Referral processing (outpatient/inpatient)
- Case management for emergency room visits and inpatient hospital stays
- Coordination of care
- Liaison support between patients and vendors
- Payment processing for contracted care
- Emergency Medical Assistance Program (EMA) available for eligible Muscogee (Creek) citizens
- Vision program available for eligible Muscogee (Creek) citizens

Eligibility Requirements

- Federally recognized Indian with proof of membership via a tribal membership card or Certificate Degree of Indian Blood (CDIB)
- Residence must be within IHS-designated service area or within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation boundaries
- CHS is a payer of last resort and all other resources must be utilized first including but not limited to: Medicare, Medicaid, Sooner Care, Veteran's Benefits, Worker's Compensation, and private insurance.



Case Management

Case management for the Contract Health Services, (CHS) program is a critical component for receiving services and assistance with processing a 72-hour call-in and reporting an emergency room visit. Our staff at CHS provides the liaison support for patients and is the first-step in obtaining help for medical expenses incurred when accidents happen or hospitalization is needed for critical care.

Our case management provides the following services:

- Initial contact for reporting of emergency room visits and inpatient hospital stays
- Helps patients obtain required documentation to process the call-in e.g. medical records and discharge summaries
- Coordinates patient care with other resources and ensures continued care when needed after discharge e.g. physical therapy or other rehabilitation services
- Processes all incoming outpatient and inpatient referrals for medical review purposes
- Follows up and screens patients for alternate resources
- Assists with the appeals process

Emergency Call-In Procedures

Emergencies must be reported within 72 hours after the beginning of treatment or admission to a health care facility. The notification is extended to 30 days for the elderly 65 years of age or older who have a limiting physical condition that prevents them from notifying CHS.

Steps to follow:

2. Speak with a case manager who will take your information and ask specific questions regarding your emergency
3. If case manager is unavailable, leave your name and number. If after-hours or weekends, your call will be returned the first business day

CHR Program Guidelines

- Appointments should be called in at least ten (10) days to two (2) weeks in advance.
- All service requests for McIntosh, Hughes, Okmulgee, Okfuskee, Muskogee, Seminole and Creek counties must be called in to the Okemah Office at (918) 623-1925.
- All service requests for Wagoner and Tulsa counties must be called in to the Koweta Office at (918) 279-3483.
- A family member, friend or guardian must accompany any patient having a surgical procedure.
- Patients must have a written referral on file prior to transports to private facilities.
- Minors (under 18 years of age) must be accompanied by a parent(s) or legal guardian.
- Transportation is not provided to clients in nursing homes, jail, prisons or rehabilitation centers.
- All passengers are required to use seatbelts.
- Clients must be returned to the original pick-up location.
- Clients must be able to manage their own oxygen supplies
- No transports for seriously ill or anyone having chest pains, shortness of breath, active labor or other conditions requiring emergency care.

The MCN Community Health Representatives, (CHR) Program is staffed with five administrative staff, 24 Generalist positions and four transporter positions.

The counties covered include Okmulgee, Okfuskee, McIntosh, Hughes, Muskogee, Wagoner, Creek, Tulsa and eastern Seminole Counties. Currently the CHR Program serves 900 active clients with services such as Home Visits, Advocacy, Community Health Education, Case Management, Monitor Patient, Transportation, refer for Environmental Service and Medication delivery (limited basis).

The Express Care Clinic serves all natives as a walk-in facility. The Express Care Clinic is staffed by an experienced, Nurse Practitioner, and provides convenience to patients of all ages who are unable to be seen by their scheduled provider.

The Express Care Clinic is designed to close the gap between primary care and emergency care by offering prompt, unscheduled treatment for non-life-threatening illness and injuries.

Tribal Vision Program

The Tribal Vision Program provides assistance to eligible Creek citizens who reside within the State of Oklahoma in obtaining a vision examination and eye glasses.

Citizens are eligible every two years for this program and must fill out an application and follow these general guidelines;

- Applicant must use MCN contracted optometrist or any Tribal/IHS facility optometrist
- CONTRACT PROVIDER: Prior approval must be obtained before an appointment can be scheduled with the contract optometrist
- TRIBAL FACILITY: Applicant must provide their prescription or order form from the optometrist and it must be written within a six-month period

Funding is expended based on priority guidelines with enrolled original allottees and children 18 years of age and under receiving the highest priority.

Vocational Rehabilitation

Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) will present you with a comprehensive intervention program which will help you to understand successful work ethics by providing services in a culturally relevant manner. We will combine rehabilitation with employment assistance to help you get and keep your job. Our service environment will help you with injury, disability or health related conditions with employment.

We will help you manage the limitations of your disability, in order to get and retain employment. We assess your eligibility and vocational rehabilitation needs and provide counseling and guidance. We also provide referral services and help with physical and mental restoration of our clients. Arrangements can be made for interpreter services for individuals who are hearing impaired as well as reader services. We do assist with job search, job placement assistance and retention services for our clients. We provide occupational license, tools, equipment and supplies. We also offer rehabilitation technology for our clients.

Eligibility:

- Be a member of a federally recognized American Indian Tribe
- Live within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation jurisdictional area
- Have a physical and/or mental impairment that makes it very difficult for you in getting or keeping employment
- Demonstrate with “clear and convincing evidence” that once you have received services you will be able to work



Affordable Care Act (ACA)

In March 2010, the President of the United States signed the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) health reform into law. The law includes an individual mandate that requires individuals, their children and anyone listed as a dependent on their taxes, to shop and enroll for health insurance coverage through the online Marketplace, aka the Exchange. If an individual and their dependent already have health insurance through their work, there will not be a need to enroll in the Marketplace. Furthermore, the mandate requires the uninsured population to obtain coverage or pay a tax penalty. The Marketplace began enrolling patients on October 1, 2013 with the coverage starting January 1, 2014. There are many aspects to this law, including, but not limited to;



- Ends pre-existing condition exclusions for children
- Keeps young adults covered (under 26-eligible for parents plan)
- Ends arbitrary Withdrawals of Insurance Coverage
- Guarantees the patients right to appeal
- Ends lifetime limits on coverage
- Reviews Premium increases (insurance companies now have to publicize reason for increase)
- Premium dollars spent are put towards health care and not Insurance administration costs
- Covers Preventive Care at no cost to patient
- Able to still choose primary doctor from plan
- Emergency services no longer have to fall within plans network

Special Provisions for American Indian/Alaska Natives

There are special provisions and exemptions within the ACA that affects the American Indian/Alaska Native population including the following;

- Members of Indian tribes are exempt from the individual responsibility payment for not complying with the requirement to maintain essential insurance coverage.
- AI/ANs with household incomes below 300 percent of the federal poverty level who are enrolled in a Marketplace Insurance company offered through the Marketplace will not have to pay any cost-sharing (co-pays or deductibles)
- If an AI/AN is enrolled in an health insurance and receives services directly from IHS, Indian tribe, tribal organization, urban Indian organization or through the Contract Health Service program, the individual will not have to pay any cost sharing for those services
- Exchanges are to provide special monthly enrollment periods for AI/ANs

Educational Awareness / Enrollment Plan

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation (MCN) Department of Health is committed to providing educational awareness and enrollment assistance to the Muscogee (Creek) Nation communities. A plan of action has been created which includes the following:

1. Educational/Awareness

- There are ACA posters, brochures and pamphlets that have been distributed at all clinics, community centers and Tribal facilities
- MCN Department of Health is a Certified Application Counselor Organization
- MCN Department of Health staff have been trained to assist the MCN communities with Affordable Care Act education, enrollment and research; please ask to speak with a Patient Benefits Coordinator at your local MCN health facility
- Local media outlets are being utilized for posting Affordable Care Act updates

2. Enrollment:

- All MCN Health facilities will be utilized to hold Marketplace Insurance Enrollment Fairs, the dates and locations will be announced in local media outlets
- The Five Marketplace insurance plans, located below, will be invited to attend the Marketplace enrollment fairs
 1. Blue Cross Blue Shield of Oklahoma
 2. Coventry Health and Life Insurance
 3. Aetna Life Insurance
 4. Community Care
 5. Global Health
- Oklahoma Health Care Authority will be invited to attend the Marketplace enrollment fairs

3. Affordable Care Act Facts:

- American Indians/Alaska Natives are:
 1. Exempt from the individual mandate penalty for not being insured
 2. Exempt from most cost sharing (co-pays and deductibles) in exchange plans:
- If you currently have Medicaid, Sooner Care, Medicare, or health insurance, the ACA does not affect you at all and you are not required to purchase additional coverage, unless you are interested in researching for a more affordable option
- Zero cost sharing plans – For AI/AN under 300 percent Federal Poverty Level (FPL) no cost-sharing anywhere the individual seeks care
- Patients may continue to receive care at the Muscogee (Creek) Nation health facilities or any Indian Health Service facility
- Limited cost sharing plans – AI/AN above 300 percent FPL there is no cost-sharing for services provided by the Muscogee (Creek) Nation or through Contract Health Services
- American Indians/Alaska Natives can enroll in a health plan, or change plans, on a monthly basis, rather than only during the annual open enrollment period
- For American Indians/Alaska Natives to be exempt for not being insured, they must file for an Exemption. There are two Indian-Specific exemptions that can be applied for; if you are a member of a federally recognized American Indian you can apply for your exemption in the Marketplace or through the Internal Revenue Service when you file your 2014 taxes.

4. Marketplace Insurance Subsidies

If your family income is less than four times the published Federal Poverty Guideline (400 percent of FPL) for your household size, and you are not eligible for employer or other public assisted healthcare (such as Medicaid or Medicare), you will be able to receive premium subsidies to help you purchase affordable insurance through the Health Insurance Marketplace. The subsidy comes in the form of a “tax credit” which you will receive when you file your 2014 tax return. A tax credit advance will be paid directly to the insurance provider you choose, reducing the monthly premium you have to pay. If at the end of the year your income turns out to be more or less than expected, the tax credit will be adjusted and added to or taken from any tax refund or payment due.

10 QUESTIONS ABOUT ENROLLING IN HEALTH INSURANCE EXCHANGE PLANS

1. HOW WILL I BENEFIT FROM HAVING HEALTH INSURANCE?

Contract Health Services (CHS) does not have enough money to meet all the needs, so there is a priority list and sometimes CHS runs out of money. If you have health insurance, you can get the health services you need even if it is not high on the CHS priority list and even if CHS is out of money. Health insurance will pay for things that your MCN Department of Health does not provide, such as medical specialists, and certain test, emergency room visits, and hospital care.

2. IF I ENROLL IN AN EXCHANGE PLAN, WILL I HAVE TO GET MY HEALTH CARE FROM A CLINIC FAR AWAY FROM WHERE I LIVE?

No. You can continue to use your MCN health clinic. Let patient registration know that you have insurance so that they can receive payment for services they provide to you.

3. WILL THERE BE A COST TO ME TO ENROLL IN A HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN?

When you use the Health Insurance Exchange website, you will find out if you qualify for programs that pay all or a portion of the costs of health insurance.

4. I AM ELIGIBLE FOR INDIAN HEALTH SERVICES SO WHY DO I NEED TO HAVE HEALTH INSURANCE?

MCN Department of Health gets about half the funding they need from the Indian Health Service. The MCN Department of Health must get the other half of funding from other sources, such as billing insurance. Health insurance is optional for American Indians and Alaska Natives. There is no penalty if you choose not to enroll in an Exchange Plan.

5. WHAT ABOUT THE FEDERAL TRUST RESPONSIBILITY? SHOULDN'T THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT PAY FOR ALL OF MY HEALTH CARE?

The Federal Government is paying for Indian health care through many programs in addition to the Indian Health Service. In the new Health Insurance Exchanges, the Federal government is paying a portion of the cost of insurance. Also, there are special provisions of the Federal government to pay the co-pays and deductibles for American Indians and Alaska Native enrolled in Exchange Plans.

6. ISN'T IT "DOUBLE DIPPING" FOR MCN DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO RECEIVE FUNDING FROM CONGRESS AND ALSO BILL MY INSURANCE?

Congress expects MCN Departments to Health to bill other insurance. The funding for Indian health care comes from many sources. The money is needed to provide services for everyone in our Muscogee (Creek) Nation communities.

7. WHAT IF I ALREADY HAVE HEALTH INSURANCE?

If you already have health insurance through your job, you will not be eligible for the Health insurance Exchange. If you are eligible for Medicaid, Medicare or the State Child Health Insurance Program (SCHIP), you will not be able to enroll in an Exchange Plan. Tell your MCN health clinic about your health insurance.

8. HOW CAN I GET HELP TO ENROLL IN EXCHANGE PLANS?

Your MCN health clinic can help you find out if you are eligible to enroll in an Exchange plan. Starting in 2013, there will be a new website that simplifies the eligibility and enrollment process. Your privacy will be protected by federal law and the information you provide will be treated confidentially.

9. WHAT ABOUT ALL THE PAPERWORK FROM HEALTH INSURANCE COMPANIES?

You can ask that the paperwork be sent to your MCN health clinic instead of your home. Your clinic can monitor the paperwork and let you know when there's something you need to do.

10. WHAT SHOULD I DO NEXT?

Go to your MCN health clinic and ask for help to see if you qualify for an Exchange Plan. Bring your Social Security card. You have a choice. If you decide to enroll in a health insurance plan, you will be helping yourself, your family and your Muscogee (Creek) Nation community!

WHAT TRIBAL MEMBERS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT HEALTH INSURANCE EXCHANGES

WHAT IS HEALTH INSURANCE?

Health insurance is a little like car insurance. For car insurance, you pay premium to the insurance company and they pay a portion of the costs if your car is wrecked. If you have health insurance, the insurance plan will pay for a portion of the costs for your visit to the doctor, emergency room and hospital stays, medical tests, prescription drugs. Health insurance companies offer several types of plans that cover different health services.

HEALTH INSURANCE EXCHANGES ALLOW PEOPLE TO PURCHASE HEALTH INSURANCE PLANS.

A Health Insurance Exchange is a computer website where individuals can buy health insurance for themselves and their family, small businesses can buy health insurance of their employees, and Tribes can buy health insurance for their members. Starting January 1, 2014, there will be an Exchange in each state operated by the state or federal government.

THE COST FOR HEALTH INSURANCE DEPENDS ON YOUR INCOME.


The premium is a monthly amount that is paid to the insurance company. The federal government pays a portion of the premiums for low and middle income people who purchase insurance through Exchanges. Sometimes Tribes or other organizations will pay for the rest of the premium cost. Check with your MCN Health Clinic to see what they recommend.

AMERICAN INDIANS AND ALASKA NATIVES WHO ENROLL IN HEALTH INSURANCE EXCHANGE PLANS DO NOT HAVE COST SHARING.

Cost sharing is the term used for both the deductibles and co-pay. A deductible is the amount most consumers pay each year before the insurance company pays for health services. A co-pay is the amount most consumers pay at each visit. For American Indians and Alaska Native sight health insurance, there is never any cost sharing when you get your services from your MCN Health Clinic. The rules for cost sharing for services provided outside Indian health clinics can be complicated, but your MCN Health Clinic will know how to help so that you never have to pay cost sharing.

HEALTH INSURANCE EXCHANGE HAS A WEBSITE.

- People at your MCN Health Clinic can help you access the Exchange website.
- You will be asked a few questions and the information will be entered into the computer.
- The website will determine if you are eligible for Exchange plans or other programs, such as Medicaid and State Child Health Insurance Program (SCHIP)
- Information from your federal income tax will be used to determine whether you qualify for programs that reduce or eliminate the cost of health insurance.
- After you see what programs are available, you can decide whether you want to enroll. Enrollment can be done on the website.





Indian Child Welfare

• Foster Care/Adoption Program

The Foster Care Program mission is to protect the best interest of Muscogee (Creek) children and promote the stability and security of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation through licensing of tribal foster homes.

Eligibility:

- Must be at least 21 years of age
- Must be an enrolled member of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation or another federally recognized tribe or eligible for enrollment (CDIB required)
- Must have the emotional, physical, and financial means to provide for a child's needs
- Must complete the certification process



Foster care is a needed and valued service of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation. Some children, for a variety of reasons, cannot live with their own families. These children need special temporary care from safe, loving, and dedicated families until they can be reunited with their birth family.

• Child Protective Services (CPS)

Reports of abuse and neglect are received by Intake Specialists and investigated by a Child Protection Services Investigator. CPS conducts joint investigations with the Department of Human Services (DHS) when a report involving a Muscogee (Creek) child that resides within the MCN tribal jurisdiction is received by DHS and CPS is notified.



• Child Treatment Services



When children are removed from their home due to abuse or neglect. Tribal Child Treatment Workers provide services to families whose children have been placed into custody of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation. Services provided are designed to work with parents in the reunification process to correct conditions that led to the removal of their children.

• State Child Treatment Workers

State Child Treatment Workers provide services to families whose children have been placed into custody of the State of Oklahoma, (by recommendation the Oklahoma Department of Human services) when children are removed from their home due to abuse or neglect. Services provided are designed to work with parents in the reunification process to correct conditions that led to the removal of their children.

State child treatment workers also, monitor cases in state courts throughout Oklahoma and the United States to ensure compliance with the Indian Child Welfare Act.

Promoting Safe & Stable Families

The Promoting Safe & Stable Families Program provides family preservation and support services designed to accomplish the following:

- Protect children from harm
- Help children at risk of foster care placement to remain safely with their families
- Help families at risk or in crisis


The program receives referrals from Indian Child Welfare, the Department of Human Services, and other social service agencies and voluntary request for services.

Family Service workers conduct in home family assessments and develop service plans to increase the stability of families.

Services provided include:

- Budgeting Education
- Parenting Skills
- Health and Nutrition Education
- Resource and Referral Information and limited transportation to resources
- Limited financial assistance

Participants in this program will be placed on a voluntary service plan for a period ranging from 60 to 180 days depending on their needs. Family Preservation caseworkers will conduct regular home visits to monitor the participant's progress to ensure families are receiving needed services.

Elderly Nutrition Program

The Elderly Nutrition Program provides basic nutrition services through nine outlying offices throughout the Muscogee Nation. The main number for the ENP administrative offices is (918) 549-2600.

New Participant:

- An intake form is to be completed and a copy of CDIB is needed. If the elder upon first visit to nutrition site, does not have a CDIB he/she will be allowed one courtesy meal.

Native American:

- Must be 55 years old or older
- Must have a CDIB

Homebound:

- Has a physical and/or mental impairment
- Lives in an isolated area with limited financial resources
- Does not have reliable transportation
- Has a home provider, however, the provider is not eligible for a free meal
- Lives on a route where meals are delivered
- Must be home for meals to be delivered

Non elderly who can eat a free meal:

- An individual who has a physical and/or mental impairment as per a doctor's statement and live with and eligible participant and accompany the person who is eligible to a congregate meal can receive a free meal
- All others who are not 55 years old or older are required to pay for a guest meal of \$4 (this amount subject to change.)

Home Delivery: After a three day absence the meals will be stopped. It is the participant's responsibility to contact the Nutrition Site Head Cook of the return for meal delivery to be continued.



Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is defined as a pattern of behavior in any relationship that is used to gain or maintain power and control over an intimate partner. Abuse can be physical, sexual, emotional, economic or psychological actions or threats of actions that influence another person. This includes any behaviors that frighten, intimidate, terrorize, manipulate, hurt, humiliate, blame, injure or wound someone.



Sexual Assault

Sexual violence occurs anytime a person is forced, coerced, and/or manipulated into unwanted sexual activity. Sexual assault is defined as any sexual activity involving a person who does not or cannot (due to alcohol, drugs, or some sort of incapacitation) consent. Sexual assault or rape can be committed by anyone, including a spouse, boyfriend/girlfriend, family member, friend, acquaintance, or even a stranger.



Dating Violence

Dating violence is a pattern of abusive behaviors used to exert power and control over a dating partner. Any teen or young adult can experience violence, abuse or unhealthy behaviors in their dating relationships.



Stalking

A good working definition of stalking is a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to feel fear. A stalker may repeatedly call you, follow you, send unwanted gifts, letters, texts and/or emails. Stalking is serious, often violent, and can escalate over time.



Community Outreach

Presentations can be provided to your community, agency, school, or organization on the topics of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence and stalking. Specific presentations for youth are available on the topics of healthy dating relationships, teen dating violence, sexting and sexual assault and consent. Please contact our office for more information or to schedule a presentation for your group!

Food Distribution Program

The Food Distribution Program provides nutritious foods to qualifying low-income Native American households as an alternative to SNAP. The Food Distribution Programs goal is to provide timely services to any eligible household while preserving their pride and dignity. What are the eligibility requirements for Food Distribution Benefits?

1. Application (Found on Website)
2. CDIB/Citizenship Card
3. Social Security cards for all household members
4. Current utility bill with name and address
5. Income for the past 30 days



Foods Available:

- Frozen ground beef, beef roast, turkey, ham, chicken and canned meats.
- Canned fruits and vegetables; canned soups; and spaghetti sauce
- Macaroni and cheese, pastas, cereals, rice, and other grains
- Cheese, egg mix; and low-fat ultra high temperature milk, nonfat dry milk and evaporated milk
- Flour, cornmeal, bakery mix, and reduced sodium-crackers
- Low-fat refried beans, dried beans, and dehydrated potatoes
- Canned juices and dried fruit
- Peanuts and peanut butter
- Vegetable Oil

Social Services

Social Security Program



The Social Security program serves as a liaison between enrolled Creek citizens and the Social Security Administration Office. Should a citizen need guidance in applying for Social Security, Disability, Death Benefits, Medicare, Medicaid, etc., he or she may contact the office.

Where to apply for Services?


An applicant may request for services at the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Social Security Office (located in the Solomon McCombs Building at the MCN Tribal Complex, Loop 56 & Hwy 75) or by calling the office.

Air Conditioning Program

The Air Conditioning Program provides small (10 BTU or 12 BTU) window units to enrolled Creek citizens who are 55 years of age or older and have an inadequate air conditioning unit or no air conditioning unit.

Documentation required:

- Copy of citizenship cards for all household members or a printout out from the Citizenship Office
- Copy of Social Security cards for all household members
- Copy of birth certificate and/or driver licenses for non-Indian household members
- A statement from the landlord, neighbor, CHR, home health provider, etc., stating the home has no air conditioning unit or an inadequate unit. (A social worker/staff member may come to the home to verify)
- Additional information may be required to determine eligibility
- Under 55 years of age with a medical need and have an inadequate air conditioning unit or no air conditioning unit
- Medical documentation/doctor statement stating the medical condition and the need of air conditioning for health purposes



The program is available each summer on a first come first serve basis and one (1) unit per eligible household. Applicants shall not receive ac units consecutively. Applicants may apply every two years, as long as he/she meets eligibility requirements.

BIA Burial Assistance

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Social Services BIA Burial Program is subject to annual Congressional appropriations, pursuant to 25 C.F.R. §20.102 (c). Should funds become unavailable, applications will continue to be processed and payments will be made retroactive to the application date once funds become available. Additional information may be submitted for eligibility redetermination. In the event funding is unavailable, the tribe will pay for CREEKS ONLY who meet BIA Burial guidelines.

The BIA burial assistance program is an indigent burial assistance program based on available resources and need. This program provides assistance to families of a deceased citizen enrolled with a federally recognized tribe with funeral costs. Assistance up to \$2,400 may be available and varies based on available resources and need including, but not limited to: insurance policies, burial policies, individual Indian monies (IIM) accounts, bank accounts, social security, VA benefits, etc. The deceased must have lived in the Muscogee (Creek) Nation service area. Payment is made directly to the funeral home. Reimbursements are not allowed.



Documentation required:

- Copy of citizenship card for deceased or a printout from the deceased's tribal Citizenship Office
- Copy of Social Security card for deceased
- Copy of signed burial contract
- Resident verification for deceased. Mail must have been received and postmarked within 30 days prior to death
- Available resources include, but not limited to: insurance policies, burial policies, Individual Indian Monies (IIM) accounts, bank accounts, Social Security, VA benefits, etc.
- Must provide most recent bank statement.
- Should insurance policies, burial policies, Social Security, VA, etc., not pay, a statement on the company's letterhead is required.
- Copy of death certificate (May take more than 30 days to receive.)
- Must apply within 30 days from date of death
- Additional information may be required to determine eligibility.

BIA General Assistance

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Social Services BIA General Assistance Program is subject to annual Congressional appropriations, pursuant to 25 C.F.R. §20.102 (c). Should funds become unavailable, applications will continue to be processed and payments will be made retroactive to the application date once funds become available. Additional information may be submitted for eligibility redetermination.

The BIA General Assistance Program is a secondary resource to help Native Americans become more self-sufficient. The program provides cash assistance to citizens who are enrolled with a federally recognized tribe. All applicants must complete their Case Plan (CP) and Individual Self-Sufficiency Plan (ISP) in order to receive assistance. Self-Sufficiency activities are required and include, but are not limited to, applying for TANF, job searches, filing for unemployment benefits, applying for SNAP or commodities, other tribal programs, etc. Amount of assistance varies by the number of eligible household members, shelter expense, available resources and the day the application is made. Applicant must live in the Muscogee (Creek) Nation service area. Check is payable to the applicant for general living expenses. Guidelines apply.



Documentation required

- Copy of citizenship cards for all household members or a printout from a tribal Citizenship Office
- Copy of social security cards for all household members
- Copy of birth certificate and/or driver licenses for non-Indian household members
- Resident verification Mail must have been received and postmarked within 30 days prior to application.
- Additional information will be required to determine eligibility.
- All tasks/activities listed on CP and ISP must be completed for approval.

In accordance to Subpart C-Direct Assistance Eligibility for Direct Assistance at 25 CFR §20.300-§20.319, applicants/recipients must:

- Actively seek employment and accept local and seasonal employment
- Report any changes which may affect eligibility These changes include, but are not limited to, residence, employment, income/resources (earned and unearned), and household members.
- Provide information to the social worker in the development of the CP and ISP and sign the document
- Perform all tasks defined in the CP and ISP
- Participate successfully in treatment and counseling services identified in the CP and ISP
- Participate in evaluation of job readiness and/or other testing required for employment purposes

BIA Individual Indian Monies (IIM) Assessments

The Social Services Office shall conduct case management of supervised IIM accounts, evaluate the needs of an account holder, develop distribution plan (DP), monitor implementation of DP, review case file six (6) months after beginning date of initial DP, review receipts in accordance with DP, and petition court for appointment or change of legal guardian when appropriate (25 CFR §20.403 (b) (2) (vi)).

What is an IIM Account?

An IIM account is an interest bearing account for trust funds held by the U.S. Secretary of the Interior that belong to a person who has an interest in trust assets. These accounts are under the control and management of the secretary.

Types of Restricted/Supervised Accounts

1. Minor – means an individual who is not an adult as defined in 25 cfr §115.400.
2. All IIM accounts established by BIA for minors will be supervised by BIA (25 cfr §115.400).
3. Emancipated minor – means a person less than 18 years of age who is married or who is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be legally able to care for himself/herself.
4. Adult non-compos mentis – means a person who has been determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unsound mind or incapable of managing his or her own affairs (25 cfr §115.002).
5. Adult in need of assistance – means an individual who has been determined to be “incapable of managing or administering his or her property, including his or her financial affairs”
6. Adults under legal disability – means the lack of legal capability to perform an act which includes the ability to manage or administer his or her financial affairs as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or another federal agency where the federal agency has determined the adult requires a representative payee and there is no legal guardian to receive federal benefits on his or her behalf (25 cfr §115.002).

Circumstances for BIA to Restrict an IIM Account

Protective services - those services necessary to protect an Indian who is the victim of an alleged or substantiated incident of abuse, neglect or exploitation or who is under the supervision of the bureau in regard to the use and distribution of funds in his or her IIM account (25 cfr §115 subpart c & 25 cfr §20 subpart d).

1. Court order identifying the account holder as non-compos mentis
2. Determines through an administrative process that the account holder is an adult in need of assistance.
3. Receives information from another federal agency that the account holder is under a legal disability and the agency has appointed a representative payee.

Hardship Program



The hardship program provides assistance to enrolled Creek citizens who have experienced a break in income or an extenuating circumstance causing a financial hardship beyond the control of the applicant. Direct vendor payments may be used towards shelter or utility costs up to \$500 per year. Guidelines apply.

A break in income includes but not limited to, unanticipated break not due to personal fault, including: lay off, self-employed loss, medical leave, loss of child support, etc.

Extenuating circumstance include, but are not limited to: major car repairs for those employed, out-of-pocket medical expenses, separation/divorce, death of a household member who contributed income, homeless, and a justifiable relocation.

Documentation required

- Copy of citizenship cards for all household members or a printout out from the Citizenship Office
- Copy of Social Security cards for all household members
- Copy of birth certificate and/or driver licenses for non-Indian household members

- Copy of income verification for all household members
- Documentation of break in income
- Additional information may be required, depending on situation, to determine eligibility
- Applicants should not wait for the day of cutoff, eviction, etc., to request services

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Social Services Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is funded by allocations of a regular block grant fund (Department of Health and Human Services/Administration for Children and Family) under a continuing resolution by an act of Congress.

The LIHEAP Program provides assistance to citizens, who are members of a federally recognized tribe. Assistance includes payment towards a heating and cooling bill. Amount of assistance varies and is based on the number of members in the household and income. Applicant must reside in the Muscogee (Creek) Nation service area. Applicant must meet the income guidelines. Payments are made directly to the vendor.

Documentation required

- Copy of citizenship or CDIB cards for all household members or a printout from a tribal Citizenship Office
- Copy of Social Security cards for all household members
- Copy of birth certificate and/or driver licenses for non-Indian household members
- Copy of income verification for all household members
- Copy of utility bill (Utility bill must be in the applicant or spouse's name)
- Additional information may be required to determine eligibility

It takes 30-45 days for the application to be processed before a payment is mailed to the vendor. All applicants must continue to pay their bill until they receive an approval letter from our office. Elder and disabled applications are taken first. One application per eligible household

Cooling Season is May - September 30 and eligible recipients' electric bill will be paid during this time.

Heating Season is November - March 31 and eligible recipients' gas, propane, or wood vendor bills will be paid during this time. Should the applicant heat with electric, we will consider paying the electric bill, as long as the usage verifies total electric.

Once an applicant is deemed eligible, a giveaway item(s) will be provided to the applicant. During the winter, heaters and/or blankets are available, some restrictions apply.

Medical Travel

The Medical Travel Program provides assistance to all eligible Muscogee (Creek) citizens who must travel over 25 miles to receive medical treatment, Treatment includes, but is not limited to, cancer treatment, dialysis, major surgery, or mothers who deliver prematurely, etc. Assistance provided includes reimbursement or pre-payment with toll fees, parking fees, gas, food and/or lodging. Assistance may be paid up to \$2,000 a lifetime.

Documentation Required:

- Applicant must be enrolled with the Muscogee (Creek) Nation. CDIB cards will not be accepted. Exceptions:
 - Newborn – A copy of the parent’s citizenship card is required, along with a parentage form from the hospital or the foot prints. One biological parent must be enrolled with the Muscogee (Creek) Nation
 - Child under one (1) year old and not enrolled – A copy of the parent’s citizenship card is required, along with the child’s birth certificate showing the parents’ names. One biological parent must be enrolled with the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.
- Applicant must be in need of treatment for cancer, dialysis, major surgery, or a mother who gave birth prematurely, etc. Regular routine/sick doctor appointments are not included. Documentation must be provided.
- Applicant must travel 25 miles or more to the medical facility or doctor office for treatment/ appointment. Documentation must be provided.
- Applicant must keep all receipts from tolls, parking fees, gas, food and/or lodging, etc., to be reimbursed. If the applicant receives a pre-payment, all receipts must be turned in for the amount awarded. Should the applicant not spend the amount awarded, the remaining funds must be turned in with the receipts. If funds or receipts are not turned in within 10 days of the last day of the treatment/ appointment, that amount will be deducted from the amount to be awarded on the next application. Should the applicant not comply with program guidelines, they shall not receive assistance for one (1) year. Abuse of the program shall be determined by the Social Services manager.

Home Owner/Renter Assistance

The Native American Housing and Self Determination Act (NAHASDA) Program is a Federal Program and is open to all enrolled federally recognized tribal citizens residing within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation service area with preference given to enrolled MCN citizens. Counties in MCN service area include Creek, Hughes, Mayes, McIntosh, Muskogee, Okfuskee, Okmulgee, Rogers, Seminole, Tulsa, and Wagoner (some parts of counties are out of service area). This is an income based program. All NAHSDA programs require an application and documentation.



Homeowner Assistance:

Provides assistance to citizens who are enrolled with a federally recognized tribe. The assistance provided is to prevent foreclosures to citizens who have experienced an unanticipated situation created by a financial loss, beyond the control of the applicant. Assistance is available up to \$5,000 or for a period of not more than six (6) months, on a one-time basis, and as long as funding is available. Assistance amount varies based on situation and need. Payments are made directly to vendor(s). Applicants must live in the Muscogee (Creek) Nation service area and income guidelines apply.

Renter Assistance:

Bills must be current at the time of application, except in disaster or child welfare cases. Assistance is available up to \$1,200. Additional assistance is available for disaster and child welfare cases up to \$5,000 or for a period of not more than six (6) months, on a one-time

basis. Assistance varies based on situation and need. Payments made directly to vendor(s). Applicants must live in the Muscogee (Creek) Nation service area and income guidelines apply.

Natural Disaster

The Natural Disaster Program provides assistance to enrolled Creek citizens who have experienced a fire, flood, tornado, hurricane, earthquake, etc. Assistance includes replacement of clothing, groceries, necessities, housing and/or emergency shelter costs, furniture, etc. (Electronics will not be approved.) Assistance amount varies based on the severity of the event. Applicants must apply concurrently for other resources including Red Cross. The payments are made directly to vendor(s) and the maximum benefit per event is up to \$5,000. Guidelines apply.



Documentation required

- Copy of citizenship cards for all household members or a printout out from the Citizenship Office
- Copy of Social Security cards for all household members
- Copy of birth certificate and/or driver licenses for non-Indian household members
- Resident verification (lease agreement, mail dated within 30 days from date of fire, etc.)

- Pictures of damage
- Additional information may be required to determine eligibility

School Clothing Program



The Social Services School Clothing Program is funded by the Muscogee (Creek) Nation to assist eligible Creek students. The program will provide students with a grant of \$200 to purchase school clothing items and/or foot apparel. Eligible Creek student must be at least 3-years-old and enrolled in a certified Head-Start or enrolled in Pre-K - 12th grade. Home schooled children ages 5 - 18-years-old may also be eligible. The grants will be provided in the form of a check, payable to the head of household listed on the application. The grants will be awarded once per school year.

Tribal Burial Assistance

The Tribal Burial Program provides assistance to families of a deceased enrolled Creek citizen to help alleviate some of the funeral costs. Assistance is given up to \$2,000. Should services cost less than \$2,000, that amount will be paid. Guidelines apply.



Documentation required

- Copy of citizenship card for deceased or a printout from the Citizenship Office
- If the deceased is a newborn, a copy of the parent's citizenship card is required, along with a parentage form from the hospital. One (1) biological parent must be enrolled with the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.
- If deceased is a child under one (1) year old and not enrolled, a copy of the parent's citizenship card is required, along with the child's birth certificate showing the parent(s) name. One (1) biological parent must be enrolled with the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.
- Copy of Social Security card for deceased
- Copy of signed burial contract
- Authorization from the responsible party for another person to complete the application (if needed).
- Must apply within six (6) months from date of passing

Responsible Party

Person(s) who signs the burial contract with the funeral home is considered the responsible party and must sign the Tribal Burial Application with the Social Services Office.

Authorized Person(s)

Should the responsible party not be available to sign the application, he or she may give another person permission to sign the application on their behalf and pick up the Food for Funeral voucher. The authorized person must provide a signed statement stating that authorization. In some cases, verbal authorization may be accepted.

Tribal Energy Program

Adult Protective Services

The mission of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Adult Protective Services Program shall be to protect tribal elders and adults who are vulnerable or incapacitated from abuse and/or neglect by providing prevention and protection services. Services shall promote the safety and well-being of Muscogee (Creek) elders and vulnerable/incapacitated adults and include immediate and appropriate intervention through assessment and investigation.



Adult Protective Services provides service to:

- Tribal elders being abused or neglected by family members or other caretakers
- Incapacitated adults being abused or neglected by family members or other caretakers
- Tribal elders or incapacitated adults unable to meet their own basic needs



Services Provide:

- Investigation of reports of elder or incapacitated adult abuse or neglect
- Assessments to determine if an elder or incapacitated adult is at risk of harm
- Protective services designed to protect an elder or incapacitated adult from harm, which may include case management, coordination with appropriate health care providers, and guardianship (if necessary)
- Protective placement, which may include placement of an elder or incapacitated adult in a hospital, nursing home, residential care facility, or transfer of an elder from on such institution to another
- Court advocacy (DHS, APS cases)

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)

The purpose of the MCN TANF program is to increase Native American/Alaskan Native families' ability to attain self-sufficiency by providing cash assistance, work environment opportunities, career coaching and encouraging educational goals in a consultative manner.

The program services all 11 counties in the Muscogee Nation Tribal Jurisdiction. Currently we service any federally recognized tribal citizen in: Creek, Okmulgee, Hughes, and Okfuskee counties. Presently, the program only services Creek citizens in Tulsa, Muskogee, Rogers, Mayes, Seminole, Wagoner, and McIntosh counties.

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation TANF program has strategically implemented services that position the program to provide a HAND UP and not a HAND OUT to recipients. Welfare Reform in 1996 placed a new emphasis on work and personal responsibility. The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Tribal TANF Program realizes the importance of providing meaningful work experience and career ready opportunities for our recipients by providing Value Added Services such as:

- Supportive Services - jobs skills training, professional license, special tools or equipment, driver's license, vehicle repair, transportation, clothing, grooming/hygiene and automobile insurance
- Nonrecurring Services - housing expenses, emergency shelter and utility assistance
- Youth Services - grade/attendance incentives, incentive for receipt of HS diploma, assistance for extra-curricular activities, school clothing (twice a year), grooming, school supplies and ACT/SAT fees for prep class fees


Youth Works provides a variety of service to support the employment and educational goals of youth ages 16-21. These services are in addition to the other services provided by the Employment & Training Administration.

Our services foster personal growth, healthy self-expression, inspires academic excellence, and teaches individual responsibility and respect for others. The major goal of our program is to realize true healthy growth and assist in the creation of a positive future for each student.

Higher Education Administration

The Higher Education Administration, a program of the Department of Education and Training, administers grants and scholarship programs to enrolled citizens of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation. Our purpose is to provide supplemental financial assistance to Creek students pursuing a college level education. The main objective of the program is to assist Creek citizens in obtaining a status of economic independence.

The Higher Education program will encourage scholastic achievement by promoting and supporting quality academic opportunities by providing financial assistance to members of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation in pursuing an undergraduate and post-graduate college level education. We will ensure the needs of our Creek students are addressed by providing academic, financial, and career counseling from our dedicated and experienced staff.



Post Graduate Program

The post graduate program was established to provide financial aid opportunities for members of the Creek Tribe to further their education beyond a bachelor's degree for a first time Masters, Doctoral or Professional Degree.

Muscogee (Creek) Nation Scholarship Grant (BIA Grant)

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Higher Education Program will expend funds through self-governance to award educational grants to our tribal citizens, with no minimum blood quantum required who are attending accredited institutions of higher learning. Funding for this grant is limited to Pell-eligible undergraduate students only.



Tribal Funds Grant

Tribal Funds Grant will be awarded to enrolled citizens of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation attending an accredited college or university with no blood minimum quantity required. Funding for this grant does not require Pell eligibility.

Tribal Incentive Grant

The Tribal Incentive Grant Program will award citizens of the Muscogee Nation who meet the grade point requirements at an accredited school. Students attending college with a GPA of 3.0 or better during the semester are able to apply for this program.

To help improve the quality of life for Muscogee (Creek) Nation citizens and citizens of other federally recognized tribes through the development and assertion of Native American Preference laws and the contracting rights of preferential employment, business and economic opportunities within the jurisdictional boundary of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation.



TERO Services: List of Certified Firms

A directory of certified Indian preference firms shall be published and disseminated quarterly. In addition, an entity may call or write to obtain a list of firms certified as eligible by the tribes from the TERO office.

Job Bank

TERO shall establish and administer a Job Skills Bank – a listing of skilled and un-skilled individuals. This listing shall be utilized by TERO for purposes of providing TERO certified vendors for job vacancies or to be utilized for outside private businesses seeking Muscogee (Creek) Nation citizens and citizens from federally recognized tribes for employment and for procurement purposes.



Cultural Preservation

Consistent with the tribal goals of the Sovereign Muscogee (Creek) Nation, the primary purpose of the Culture Preservation Office is to ensure the protection and preservation of valued historic and cultural resources for future generations. The Historic & Cultural Preservation Office serves as the contact for statutory and regulatory compliance consultation regarding Federal Historic and Cultural Preservation Laws.

The design and operation of the Historic & Cultural Preservation Office is to conduct documentation and preservation projects necessary for sustaining an integrated culture. The Muscogee (Creek) Nation is committed to its historic duties, not just within the jurisdictional geopolitical boundaries in Oklahoma but also within the Southeastern United States that comprise the traditional or aboriginal territory of the Mvskokvlke.



NHPA Section 106

Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) requires that federal agencies consider the effects their projects may have on historic properties and that they provide the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP) an opportunity to comment on their project. It further requires federal agencies to consult with Tribes in identifying and mitigating adverse effects on historic properties and properties of cultural significance. This office is the primary contract for these consultations and mitigations.

Library/Archives

Under the direction of the Office of Cultural and Historical Preservation Office, the Muscogee Nation Library/Archives addresses the research and information needs of both citizens and non-citizens engaging in serious inquiry into Muscogee culture and history. The Library/Archives houses a collection of over 1,600 volumes of reference materials, an almost complete set of Bureau of American Ethnology reports and bulletins and 730 reels of microfilmed records of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation from 1828 - 1840. Included in the collections, are the Final Dawes Rolls of the Five Civilized Tribes and the Grant Forman collection of Oklahoma Pioneer Histories. Also in a special collection are the private letters of Pleasant Porter, the Principal Chief of the Muscogee Nation during the allotment act in early 1900's. Due to the fragile condition, one of a kind, or limited availability of most works, all Muscogee Nation Library/Archival collections are non-circulating.



Cemetery Project





Realty Trust Services

The objective of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Realty Trust Services Department is to provide recommendations and related services to individuals in the management of Indian Trust and Restricted Land situated within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation of Oklahoma. The program is trust related services mandated by the various federal regulations and laws governing the management of restricted and trust land.



There are approximately 128,000 acres of restricted property owned by individual tribal members in need of assistance managing and protecting their property rights. Our primary goal is to ensure that clients do NOT lose their land as a result of any activity that can be prevented by providing proper assistance in the management of their restricted Indian land. An ancillary goal is to maximize the dollar value our clients receive in return for the use and sale of their restricted and trust land. Realty Trust Services also assists the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and its citizens in the transfer of land title to the United States of America in Trust, thus expanding the land base of the Nation and its citizens.





Their duties include, but are not limited to:

Below is a list of supplies to include in a basic home kit:

- Water – One gallon per person per day, for drinking and sanitation
- Food – At least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered radio – and extra batteries
- Flashlight – and extra batteries
- First Aid Kit
- Whistle – to signal for help
- Filter Mask – or cotton t-shirt, to help filter the air
- Moist towelettes – for sanitation
- Wrench or pliers – to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener – for food (if kit contains canned food)
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape – to shelter-in-place
- Garbage bags and plastic ties – for personal sanitation
- Unique family needs – such as daily prescription medications, infant formula or diapers, and important family documents



Muscogee (Creek) Nation (MCN) Emergency Management started in November 2006. The MCN Emergency Management Department has been a part of nine (9) presidentially declared disasters since 2006. The MCN Emergency Management Team works closely with all Emergency Management agencies within their jurisdiction during times of disaster. The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Transit mission is to provide the tribal members and the general public with transit services in order to access jobs, educational opportunities, human services, medical, recreation, shopping, tribal services and veterans services within the boundaries of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Tribal Jurisdiction.

Reserved

- Set Rides – Set rides within the Okmulgee area can be made by anyone who has an appointment time for work, doctors, clinic, school, or any other appointment, and must be reserved two (2) hours prior to pick-up time.
- All “In-County” reserved set rides must be made in 24 hour advance with a pick up time 30 minutes before the appointment time.
- All “County-To-County” set rides must be made 72 hours prior to appointment time
- Any citizens who call-in without prior advance notice will not be guaranteed to be picked up on time.

Daily Demand Rides

- Available for anyone who needs transportation to run errands, grocery shop, Wal-Mart, pay bills, etc.
- Transit will start pick-ups at 8:15 a.m. - 4 p.m. (Last set ride is 3:45 pm)
- Drivers will only wait for three (3) minutes, after which time the driver will leave and a new call will need to be made for another driver.

Ride to Work



The Tribal Driveways Program is to provide maintenance of accessible driveways for Muscogee (Creek) Nation enrolled tribal members and property owners, who reside within the territorial jurisdiction of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation. This program addresses the needs of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation citizens, to repair or replace existing driveways. The selection of eligible families/individuals to participate in this program will be made by the Tribal Driveways Program Manager. Selection shall be based on all the factors contained in the application, an on-site inspection of the land/property, and the amount of funding currently available to Tribal Driveways.



Eligibility

Limited to no more than one (1) service every four (4) years for the property seeking services. Tribal Driveways will do the repair work on driveways/road at no charge. Each project will be limited.

The mission of the Secretary of the Nation is to promote and encourage the development of foreign and domestic commerce of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and to foster, serve, and promote the Nation's economic development and technological advancement.

The goal of the department is to expand the Tribal economy by implementing a strategy dealing with the components of economic development practice including organizational development, infrastructure development, business development, workforce development, and cash flow development.

The Secretary of the Nation shall serve as a clearinghouse for all entities and individuals seeking to do business with the Muscogee (Creek) Nation. The Secretary shall coordinate all activities associated with Title 3, "Corporations and Business Entities," of the Muscogee Nation Code Annotated and with Title 33, "Uniform Commercial Code." The Secretary shall monitor the storage and use of the Great Seal of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, conduct negotiations with outside entities when directed, be the lead governmental agency responsible for the attraction and encouragement of commerce with businesses in and outside the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, and perform additional duties as determined by the principal chief.

Small Business Development Center

The Small Business Development Center was created to provide assistance to individuals who are interested in starting a business or have a need to improve an existing business. - Provide all requested information including Creek Citizenship and Social Security cards and sign all required forms including the Consent for Disclosure of Information.

Housing Programs

Emergency Repair for Privately Owned Homes Program



The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Program is designed to help tribal citizens to repair any emergency circumstances that may befall his/her home that would endanger the health & safety of those residing in the structure. Eligible emergency repairs would include: electrical, plumbing, handicap access, heating & air conditioning, deterioration of ceiling & walls, installation of utilities, etc.

Requirements:

- Applicants must have owned and occupied the home for at least three years.
- Applicants may qualify as a single adult or family (includes a family with or without children, an elderly family, a near elderly family or a disabled family and a single person). At least one family member must be of Native American descent. There is MCN Preference.
- Applicant must be 18 years of age or older.
- Applicant must qualify as low income family, whose income does not exceed 80 percent of the national median income, as set by HUD. Income limits are based the size of the family.
- All required documentation and forms must be completed and signed at time of submitting the application.

Lease With Option To Purchase Program

A Muscogee (Creek) Nation low-income housing program that assists qualifying low-income MCN Citizens in the obtaining of a home that has already been constructed, soon to be constructed, or that has been provided through bank acquisition. All payments are based on the income amount of the applicant and not on his/her credit score.

Requirements:

- Applicants may qualify as a single adult or family (includes a family with or without children, an elderly family, a near elderly family or a disabled family and a single person). Head of household or spouse must be of Native American descent. There is MCN Preference.
- Applicant must be 18 years of age or older.
- Applicant must be willing to live within the Muscogee (Creek) Nation jurisdictional area.
- Applicant must qualify as low income family, whose income does not exceed 80 percent of the national median income, as set by HUD. Income limits are based the size of the family.
- The minimum income of the Applicant must be no less than *\$5,000 annually. **This number is apt to change, call MCN Housing to check for updates.*
- All required documentation and forms must be completed and signed at time of submitting the application.



Mobile Home Transport & Set Up Program

The Muscogee (Creek) Nation Transport & Set Up Program will assist lower income MCN Citizens with transportation of a mobile home up to 400 miles to a permanent foundation. The mobile home may be new or used at time of pick up, and must be the citizen's primary residence. The permanent foundation site must have water and electric services already there at time of delivery. MCN will assist in hooking utility services (Gas, Electric, Sewer, etc.) up to the mobile home at the time of delivery.

Requirements:

- Applicants may qualify as a single adult or family (includes a family with or without children, an elderly family, near elderly family or disabled family and a single person). At least one family member must be of Native American descent. There is MCN preference
- Applicant must be 18 years of age or older.

Mortgage Down Payment & Closing Cost Program

The Mortgage Assistance and Closing Costs Program helps Native American Families become first-time homeowners. Because of the high cost of obtaining a mortgage loan, many Native American families find it difficult to become homeowners. The Mortgage Assistance Program helps eligible families meet this problem by helping with grant assistance for down payment and closing costs. To be eligible, clients must meet program guidelines established by the Native American Housing and Self-Determination Act (NAHASDA). If a client is determined eligible, they will be referred to a HUD certified lender.



Requirements:

- Must live within the State of Oklahoma
- Be a first time buyer
- Not on an existing or former Mutual Help Participant of NAHASDA Home buyer/ Lease with option to Purchase regardless of a Housing Service Area
- Have an annual family income between 50-80 percent of the national Median income published by HUD. See Income Guidelines
- Be 18 years or Older
- Provide all requested information, CDIB for preference purposes, Social Security cards, and employment verification for each working family member on the required forms
- Sign all required forms including the consent for disclosure of information
- Be able to meet all credit check and financial obligations for loan assistance from an approved and certificated financial lender

Residential Community Rental Housing Program



The Housing Division Rental Properties Program provides low cost rental housing for Native American families. The Affordable Housing Program consists of four rental properties located in Okmulgee, Okemah, Checotah, Eufaula and an Elderly Housing Addition also located in Okmulgee. The Housing Division manages over 300 living units with each of the four main rental locations having approximately 75 units (duplexes).

Requirements:

- Have an Annual Income, which does not exceed the applicable HUD income limits
- Be 18 years of age or older or be 17 years old and married, or emancipated.
- Provide all requested information, including Social Security numbers and evidence of citizenship or eligible immigration status for all members of the household plus employer identification numbers for each working family member on the required forms.
- Sign all required forms including the consent for disclosure of information.




In selecting families, it shall be the policy of the Department of Housing to make resident selections as outlined below:

- Eligible Tribal Creek Citizens who are involuntarily displaced by government action or natural disaster or by fire (does not include arson by the home buyer or criminal act.)

- Eligible large families, elderly families, near elderly families, and a family with disabilities that are Creek Tribal Citizens.
- All other Creek Citizens.
- All other tribal members.


